

State of Illinois Physical and Immunization Requirements

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR KINDERGARTEN

- HEALTH EXAMINATION – conducted within one year
 - Physical Exam – signed and dated by doctor
 - Immunization – signed and dated by doctor
 - Medical History – filled out and signed by parent
 - Physical Education – checked off by doctor
 - Mandatory Diabetes Risk Assessment

- REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS
 - DTP/DTaP/Tdap/TD – 4 or more doses, last dose after the 4th birthday.
 - POLIO – 4 or more doses of the same type of vaccine, last dose after 4th birthday. (progressive requirement)
 - MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days) later.
 - VARICELLA/Chicken Pox – 2 doses, must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks (28 days) later. (progressive requirement).

- STATE REQUIRED LEAD ASSESSMENT QUESTIONNAIRE. FOR THOSE LIVING IN ZIP CODE 60456, A LEAD TEST IS REQUIRED. THE HEALTH FORM MUST INDICATE THE DATE THE ASSESSMENT/TEST WAS ADMINISTERED BY YOUR DOCTOR.

- DENTAL EXAMINATION - On August 19, 2004, Illinois State Law HB72 was passed which mandated all children in Kindergarten have a dental exam.

- EYE EXAMINATION – required by state law as of January 1, 2008.

- TUBERCULOSIS SKIN TEST (Mantoux type) – strongly recommended

Students not meeting the above requirements will be excluded from school.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FIRST GRADE

➤ Immunizations

- DTP/DTaP/Tdap/TD – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday.
- POLIO – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday. If the series is given in any combination of polio vaccine types, 4 or more doses are required with the last being a booster on or after the 4th birthday.
- MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days)

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR SECOND GRADE

- Current Dental Exam - On August 19,2004, Illinois State Law HB72 was passed which mandated all children in 2nd grades have a dental exam.

➤ Immunizations

- DTP/DTaP/Tdap/TD – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after the 4th birthday.
- POLIO – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday. If the series is given in any combination of polio vaccine types, 4 or more doses are required with the last being a booster on or after the 4th birthday.
- MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days)
- VARICELLA/Chicken Pox – 2 doses for students entering second grade.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THIRD GRADE

➤ Immunizations

- DTP/DTaP/Tdap/TD – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after the 4th birthday.
- POLIO – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday. If the series is given in any combination of polio vaccine types, 4 or more doses are required with the last being a booster on or after the 4th birthday.
- MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days)
- VARICELLA/Chicken Pox – 2 doses for students entering second grade.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FOURTH GRADE

➤ Immunizations

- DTP/DTaP/Tdap/TD – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after the 4th birthday.
- POLIO – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday. If the series is given in any combination of polio vaccine types, 4 or more doses are required with the last being a booster on or after the 4th birthday.
- MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days)
- VARICELLA/Chicken Pox – One dose on or after the 1st birthday.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FIFTH GRADE

➤ Immunizations

- DTP/DTaP/Tdap/TD – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after the 4th birthday.
- POLIO – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday. If the series is given in any combination of polio vaccine types, 4 or more doses are required with the last being a booster on or after the 4th birthday.
- MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days)
- VARICELLA/Chicken Pox – One dose on or after the 1st birthday.

Students not meeting the above requirements will be excluded from school.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR SIXTH GRADE

- HEALTH EXAMINATION – conducted within one year
 - Physical Exam – signed and dated by doctor
 - Immunization – signed and dated by doctor
 - Medical History – filled out and signed by parent
 - Physical Education – checked off by doctor
 - Mandatory Diabetes Risk Assessment

- REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS
 - DTP/DTaP/Tdap/Td – one dose of Tdap
 - POLIO – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday. If the series is given in any combination of polio vaccine types, 4 or more doses are required with the last being a booster on or after the 4th birthday.
 - MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days)
 - VARICELLA/Chicken Pox – two doses (progressive requirement).
 - HEPATITIS B – 3 doses hepatitis B vaccine administered at recommended intervals. (4 weeks/28 days between 1st and 2nd dose, 4-month interval between 1st & 3rd dose) 2 doses Adult Recombivax-HB vaccine for ages 11-15
 - MENINGOCOCCAL CONJUGATE – applies to students entering 6th grade (Beginning 2017-18 school year. 1 dose)

- Dental Examination is mandatory: On August 19,2004, Illinois State Law HB72 was passed which mandated all children in 6th grades have a dental exam.

- A tuberculosis skin test (Mantoux type) is strongly recommended but is not required for entrance to 6th grade.

Students not meeting the above requirements may be EXCLUDED from school.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR SEVENTH GRADE

➤ Immunizations

- DTP/DTaP/Tdap/Td – one dose of Tdap
- POLIO – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday. If the series is given in any combination of polio vaccine types, 4 or more doses are required with the last being a booster on or after the 4th birthday.
- MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days)
- VARICELLA/Chicken Pox – two doses (progressive requirement).
- HEPATITIS B – 3 doses hepatitis B vaccine administered at recommended intervals. (4 weeks/28 days between 1st and 2nd dose, 4-month interval between 1st & 3rd dose) 2 doses Adult Recombivax-HB vaccine for ages 11-15
- MENINGOCOCCAL CONJUGATE – applies to students entering 7th grade (Beginning 2017-18 school year. 1 dose)

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EIGHTH GRADE

➤ Immunizations

- DTP/DTaP/Tdap/Td – one dose of Tdap
- POLIO – 3 or more doses, with the last dose qualifying as a booster if received on or after 4th birthday. If the series is given in any combination of polio vaccine types, 4 or more doses are required with the last being a booster on or after the 4th birthday.
- MMR – 2 doses, the first dose must have been received on or after the 1st birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks later (28 days)
- VARICELLA/Chicken Pox – two doses (progressive requirement).
- HEPATITIS B – 3 doses hepatitis B vaccine administered at recommended intervals. (4 weeks/28 days between 1st and 2nd dose, 4-month interval between 1st & 3rd dose) 2 doses Adult Recombivax-HB vaccine for ages 11-15
- MENINGOCOCCAL CONJUGATE – applies to students entering 8th grade (Beginning 2017-18 school year. 1 dose)

Students not meeting the above requirements may be EXCLUDED from school.
